The Ministry of Digital Policy, Telecommunications and Media is responsible for planning and implementing national policy, as well as contributing to the development of the appropriate institutional frameworks in the fields of information, audiovisual, telecommunication and communication technologies, as well as eGovernment at a European and international level.

The primary concern of the Ministry's employees is the development of those policies that will enhance accessibility to information and distance communication, improve the economy and competitiveness e.t.c

Since its establishment (November 2016), the Ministry of Digital Policy, Telecommunications and Media, has among other things undertaken the following actions:

- It has approved 213 sectoral ICT projects of other ministries (compatible with the National Digital Strategy) with a budget exceeding 790 million euros
- It implements flagship digital projects such as the Central Electronic Document Management System in the Public Sector, Intelligent Agriculture, the Barcode in the written press for the correct recording/ counting of newspaper and magazine sales, the VAR in football, the Digital Single Portal for Digitalization of Transactions between citizens, businesses and the State, etc.
- It invests 700 million Euros for the development of fiber optic networks across Greece, an initiative that has mobilized 3 billion Euros in private investments
- It subsidizes - through the National Centre of Audiovisual Media and Communication - the production of audiovisual works in Greece, with a total of € 75 million (at the current stage), promoting the country and creating new jobs in a highly dynamic industry
- It launched the licensing process for private TV channels, which has been completed by the Greek National Council for Radio and Television

The aim of the Ministry of Digital Policy, Telecommunications and Media is the Fair Digital Development, that is bringing "Tomorrow into Today for All".
